

Scripture Passages:

Two or three passages from the Bible may be appropriate. A list of suggested readings is given on p. 4; however, other readings are also appropriate. You may choose the readings yourself or the pastor will choose them after meeting with you and getting to know you better.

Vows

You may use either of the vows in the hymnal, or you may write your own. If you choose to write your own vows, they need to include a promise of lifelong faithfulness.

How will you enter the church?

All come down the center aisle:

Groom & Parents (Or groom & pastor)

Attendants enter as couples

Then bride and parents (or father as escort)

or

Groom, groomsmen & pastor enter worship area via side:

Women attendants come down aisle and are greeted by men

Bride enters w/escort (either parents or father, mother)

Groom greets bride at front of pew area.

Since parents occupy a special place in the lives of the bride and groom, it is appropriate to have both mother and father participate in the processional (entering the church).

If Holy Communion is celebrated, it will be offered to all Christians in attendance.

Unity Candle

A candle-lighting ceremony is appropriate as a symbol of uniting in marriage. You need to purchase a large candle for the center and two regular 10" dinner candles, one for each side.

Two sets of candelabra are available. One set is free-standing and would be placed at the sides of the altar. One set is shorter and would be placed on the altar. You provide 14 candles, 12" tapers, for whichever set you choose. You will need to purchase the candles for the candelabra.

Photography and Videotaping

Photography usually is not permitted during the worship service. The professional photographer is asked to speak with the pastor about photography prior to the service.

Videotaping is permitted but with discretion. A tripod set at one side of the chancel is helpful. Consult pastor.

Music

Music occupies a significant place in the marriage service; it is important that the couple consult the church musicians.

A wedding is a worship service as well as a marriage. Consider including at least one congregational hymn. You may choose a favorite hymn or a hymn appropriate for praise and celebration. Examples are : "Joyful, Joyful, We Adore You," "Beautiful Savior,"

"I Was There to Hear Your Borne Cry."

Rehearsal

It is customary to have a rehearsal, especially if there are significant numbers of people involved in the service. Please consult the pastor for scheduling of rehearsal.

Marriage License

The pastor is legally responsible for the delivery of the license to the appropriate civil authority. Please bring the marriage license to the church office at least two days prior to the marriage. The license will be signed during/after the ceremony. You will be given a copy. The "official" copy will be mailed to the county clerk on the first mailing day after the ceremony.

11. If you desire the pastor to attend the wedding dinner & reception, please include him/her on your invitation list. Misunderstandings can occur when the couple assumes that the pastor automatically is invited. Invitations can be addressed to:

Wedding Music & Liturgy

A wedding at Messiah Lutheran Church is a celebration of Christian marriage. It affirms that God in Christ Jesus loves us and wants us to love others. Our family and community are involved in the liturgy.

In planning the liturgy, remember that we seek God's presence and blessing, as well as the presence and blessing of our guests.

There is a diversity of music available. Such music is not to entertain but to create a worship setting to the Glory of God.

Congregational singing is always appropriate. Perhaps the bride and groom have favorite hymns from which choices can be made.

The following guidelines are offered to assist in the planning of the marriage liturgy:

1. Select musician/organist as soon as possible---several months prior to the wedding is a minimum. Consult Kathy Strazzinski (869-7871) for organist or pianist.
2. If a vocalist is desired, consult the church office.
3. If soloist/vocalist will be utilizing instruments other than the organ or piano, please consult with the pastor.
4. Contacts between soloists/vocalists and organist/pianist are vital. Therefore, names and phone numbers should be exchanged as soon as possible.
5. When selecting a processional, consider the number of attendants in the wedding party---as well as parents and children who may be included in the processional.
6. Musical selections from sources other than the hymnal, *Evangelical Lutheran Worship*, need to be approved by the pastor.
7. Some questions to consider when choosing music:
 - Does the music promote marriage in a Christian setting?
 - Is the music appropriate for a wedding celebration?
 - If the music speaks of love, does it promote God's love, the love of sharing, the love that builds up one another?
8. If you plan to use Messiah's sound system for vocal soloists/instrumentalists please consult with the pastor.

Scripture Readings for Marriage Services

It would be appropriate to have one reading from each of the testaments. The following are some passages commonly used during marriage services. You might have a favorite Bible story or verse that you would like to use for your service. You may substitute a secular poem or reading for one of the scripture readings, though it must be approved by the pastor.
