### Letter from Pr. Andrew

*Siblings in Christ*, As I write to you, our Council has determined that the time to return to in-person worship is nearly here. Starting on the weekend of July 3rd and 4th we will resume in-person worship in our sanctuary. Those details will arrive in a letter and can also be found online on our Facebook page ([facebook.com/messiahlutheranmq](https://www.facebook.com/messiahlutheranmq)) or our webpage ([messiahlutheranmq.org](https://www.messiahlutheranmq.org)).

It has been a long journey to reach this point. As a congregation we have adapted, shifted, flexed, and grown. We have been energized and exhausted, joyful and sad, and everything in between. We have been sick, lost loved ones, and struggled with isolation. We have sacrificed for the sake of our families and our communities – including our church. When times were the hardest, we dug deep and found ways to support one another.

While we were not able to gather in person this past year, we were able to connect over the radio and online. Our services reach many more people (~1500 a service) from all over the United States and world (UK, Canada, Colombia, Tanzania, to name a few!) every Sunday. It is a ministry that will continue even as we come back together to worship in person.

We know that a return will be different for each and every one of you. Some of you would be comfortable with no restrictions and others would not. Some of you will be here at those first services and others will not. Each of you will have to determine your own comfort with a large group gathering. I just ask that you give each other the grace to do so. While your pastors are incredibly excited to be back to in-person worship, we also are anxious about three large gatherings a weekend. I would guess that many of you also hold that tension of anxiety and excitement. Please know that is okay and that we can go slow together.

When I used to lead hiking trips in the Cascade mountains, we had a practice of inclusivity. We always had the slowest person lead us. It wasn't because we didn't trust that the fast hikers wouldn't wait, but it reminded everyone that we were doing this together. We were a community who made some

sacrifices for the sake of staying together. That is what we will do as we return to in-person worship. We will still wear masks and distance as best we can. We will care for those who cannot be vaccinated – whether due to immune conditions or because they're a kid under the age of 12. We will journey together.

As we do so, let us continue to give each other grace. We can lean into the excitement and the joy of getting to physically worship together. Come out to the beach and to the park. Hum along to the hymns behind your masks. Rejoice that we have made it to today.

### Pastors' Book Study on Shameless - June 3

In June we will be reading Nadia Bolz-Weber's "Shameless: A Sexual Reformation." Bolz-Weber writes from her own experiences, those of her congregation, and with Biblical examples to help us unravel how sex and sexuality have been used and sometimes abused within the Christian tradition to inflict "pain, suffering, and guilt on countless people." This book is intended to reform and help us reframe how we view sex and sexuality. "Along the way, Nadia reexamines patriarchy, sex, and power with candor but also with hope, because in her heart she believes the 'Gospel is powerful enough, transgressive enough, and beautiful enough to heal not only the ones who have been hurt but also those who have done the hurting.'" This book will push us to look at a topic often labeled as taboo and to open us up a conversation around faith and our bodies.

- Adult Day Service has terminated their lease with Messiah, as this service is no longer available.
- Council unanimously supported the application of Jen Elsenbroek for Deacon candidacy and will provide the funds for the application process.

## ELCA Advocacy Alerts

**COVID-19 VACCINE ACCESS:** Although a World Trade Organization (WTO) waiver of intellectual property rights for COVID-19 vaccines and treatments, known as the Trade-Related Aspects of Intellectual Property (TRIPS) agreement, is not finalized, the support for temporary ease of rules announced May 5 by the Biden Administration has potential for India and other nations to increase their access to potentially lifesaving means to stem the spread and severity of this global pandemic.

ELCA Witness in Society staff have been advocating with others to get members of the House of Representatives to also support the waiver allowing increased global access. The ELCA has also signed onto letters urging the U.S. to take this step. More members of Congress in both chambers have publicly expressed their support.

**REPARATIONS:** H.R. 40, the Commission to Study and Develop Reparation Proposals for African Americans Act, is poised for a vote in the House of Representatives – the first time the bill has received a vote since its introduction in 1989. If passed, a 13-person commission would be formed to study the lasting effects of slavery.

That commission would submit its findings, recommendations and suggested remedies to Congress. In 2019, the ELCA Church Council called for action to further “engage in anti-racism and racial justice work, work toward economic justice—including the study of reparations.” The Declaration to People of African Descent adopted by the ELCA Churchwide Assembly that same year offered a public apology to people of African descent which acknowledges that racism and white supremacy are deeply rooted in our history and that the church is complicit. An Action Alert expressing support for H.R. 40 is available in the Action Center, and ELCA staff are continuing to meet with lawmakers in Congress as the bill heads to its first vote.

**UNACCOMPANIED CHILDREN AT THE BORDER:** Though there are fewer unaccompanied children in Customs and Border Patrol (CBP) custody due to more efficient processing, there are still thousands of children in government care waiting to be reunited with family or placed with a foster parent.

Witness in Society staff continue to advocate for highest standards of care for unaccompanied children and families, while advocating against the use of policies such as Title 42 public health order used to expel most migrants. Additional updates are available from ELCA AMMPARO through their @ELCAammparo social media presence and blog.

**JUST TRANSITION PRINCIPLES:** In work with policy makers, ELCA federal advocacy emphasizes that declining net emissions, while essential to respond to the threat of climate change, are not the only measures that must be considered. Clean energy transition policies should fairly distribute gains and losses.

Some of these themes are explored in the resource “Just Transition to a Sustainable Future” and “Carbon Pricing Basics,” found from [ELCA.org/resources/advocacy](https://www.elca.org/resources/advocacy).

**AFFORDABLE HOUSING:** Accessing a safe home is less affordable than ever. The Biden Administration submitted its proposed annual budget to Congress on April 9. Record high numbers of Americans are facing the risk of eviction due to the pandemic, and housing costs are climbing.

As lawmakers negotiate and make determinations for government funding distribution, utilize the ELCA Action Alert facilitating comments to lawmakers in support of funding affordable housing and homeless programs this year.

Each class member applies their own range of motion to the qigong exercises, standing or chair. We use body structure for balance, stress and pain relief in daily life; walking, turning, lifting, reaching, sitting. The gentle movements can also be used with prayer disciplines, using breathing as an essential component. Members turn off video and mute while I lead. It's a welcome anonymity -no competition, rest as you wish. In the beginning and at the end, we review together. Instead of a fee, we invite you to make a contribution to Messiah Lutheran Church's food bank at any time as a sign of thanksgiving.
