MOPS is a community of moms brought together to support one another through the struggles and joys of raising young children. The group meets once a month during the school year at Messiah.

Produce Swap at Messiah

It's that time of year where all of our gardeners share the bounty of their gardens with friends and neighbors. During the next few weeks we are setting up a table at Messiah where people can bring their produce to share, or to take some produce home with them. We are looking forward to "sharing the harvest" with the Messiah community.

Ingathering for Lutheran World Relief at Messiah

This year our ingathering of quilts, school kits, personal care kits, and baby care kits for Lutheran World Relief will be held at Messiah on Saturday October 2 from 9 am to 1 pm. Churches from the central and western UP will be unloading their items for storage in Messiah's education wing; and early the following week Messiah volunteers will be loading everything on a U-Haul for transport to the LWR warehouse in St. Paul. Please watch for a volunteer sign-up sheet on the welcome table in the next few weeks. Volunteers will be needed on October 2 as well as the following week (the date of the U-Haul loading will be determined soon). If you would like to contribute to the cost of the U-Haul and gasoline expense, please send a check with a notation of LWR U-Haul in the memo line.

We greatly appreciate the faithful work of our Messiah quilters and our Women of the ELCA circles who work to get quilts made and kits assembled. We also thank Les Scheuren who will be transporting all of these items to St. Paul.

Year of Discovery Task Force Update

At our May 2021 Synod Assembly, our Northern Great Lakes Synod strongly passed a "Resolution on the Repudiation of the Doctrine of Discovery." The Doctrine of Discovery was one of the foundations to justify colonization and mistreatment of Indigenous people in the name of the Christian church. As part of the Synod Assembly week, we hosted a listening panel as five tribal members were able to share their personal stories. For many members of our synod, this might have been their first exposure to the issues facing our Native Americans siblings.

Many people are now asking the question, "Now what?"

The Task Force on the Year of Discovery continues to meet and discuss intentional ways to engage with our Indigenous siblings in our area. We are discerning that relationships with the various tribes in our synod are best done on the local tribal level. Each tribe has their own unique opportunities and challenges. So, we are encouraging those local relationships and understandings rather than one "synod-wide" strategy.

Here's a quick summary of some of those local efforts:

Pastor Dave Van Kley, Pastor Bre Kinnunen, and Dr. Mike Coyne have met with leaders at the Center for Native American Studies at Northern Michigan University. They listened to what is going on at NMU and in the Marquette community and some important priorities.

Assistant to the Bishop, Jim Duehring attended a Native Justice Coalition event in Rapid River, Michigan. He heard about the realities of "Missing and Murdered Indigenous Peoples."

Bishop Katherine Finegan and Pastor Bucky Beach and Pastor Julie Belew attended a Water Walk as part of the Pow Wow week with the Keweenaw Bay Indian Community in Baraga, Michigan.

Pastor Melinda VanderSys is working to establish a network in the Eastern U.P.

Pastor Grant Van Lishout from the Marywood Franciscan Spirituality Center in Arbor Vitae, Wisconsin reports that Marywood is already engaging in dialogue with the Lac du Flambeau tribe in Northern Wisconsin.

Pastor Scott Ehle is building relationships with the Native community in Menominee, Michigan. Pastor Bucky Beach, Pastor Julie Belew and Jeff Henquinet continue to work in the Copper Country (U.P.) and with KBIC.

And, we are beginning to develop contacts in the Rapid River, Michigan area.

God's Spirit of love and hope is going before us.

During the first year our family is with us they are not allowed to work or to receive governmental aid. We are hoping to raise funds from church members and the wider community for housing, food, medical and legal concerns, clothing, transportation, and more. We received a check and the following letter last week:

Please find an enclosed check to be used for relocation needs for the family seeking asylum. I became aware of your congregational involvement and support of assisting a family through our dear friends Ann and Barry Johnson. I am extremely interested in your efforts as I helped resettle "boat people" of Vietnam in the 70s and 80s. I was also a pediatric nurser in a refugee camp in Thailand and experienced the physical and mental health needs of those leaving their homeland.

Fleeing danger is an incredibly risky undertaking. The assistance you will provide for this family will be pivotal in re-establishing their lives.

Thank you for all the work and guidance you will provide for this family. And, blessings to your congregation for stepping out to put faith into action.

Synod Lifelong Learning

The Northern Great Lakes Synod offers a diverse series of online classes for adults who want to increase their knowledge and understanding of the Bible, church history, Lutheran Theology, contemporary Christian issues, and more. Launched in 2020, Lifelong Faith Formation, evolved from the synod's Lay School for Mission.

Lifelong Faith Formation is not driven by an end result, such as graduation from a program. It is not a certification program to become a Licensed Lay Minister. It may play a role in an individual's discernment to participate in a higher accountability program through a neighboring synod (East Central Synod of Wisconsin or Northwest Synod of Wisconsin) or lead to seminary. Mostly, Lifelong Faith Formation is designed for curious adults who want to engage more deeply with the Bible, to learn more about church traditions, to become better equipped to serve the work of Christ in their congregations and to grow in spirituality and faith.

While pandemic restrictions have eased, these are still uncertain times. The Synod will continue to offer online classes this fall. **Two special notes:** First, some people may meet as a group out of their own congregations. Second, last year we realized that online learning presents an opportunity to connect people from across the synod—people who share a love of learning and have discovered that adult studies help them to grow in faith. Classes are FREE

but may require the purchase of textbooks or other materials. Students will receive Zoom links from their instructor. Zoom Qi Gong is held on Tuesdays from 12:00 - 1:00 pm. It is lead by Diana Magnuson (906-362-9386 or magnusondiana@gmail.com)

Each class member applies their own range of motion to the qigong exercises, standing or chair. We use body structure for balance, stress and pain relief in daily life; walking, turning, lifting, reaching, sitting. The gentle movements can also be used with prayer disciplines, using

breathing as an essential component. Members turn off video and mute while I lead. It's a welcome anonymity -no competition, rest as you wish. In the beginning and at the end, we review together. Instead of a fee, we invite you to make a contribution to Messiah Lutheran Church's food bank at any time as a sign of thanksgiving.
