From Pastor Molly

January Greetings,

When I was in college, I used to work late nights at the welcome desk and walk home through the quiet campus on dark and frigid winter nights in rural northeastern Iowa. Now, many of you know, I am not one for the cold, but there was always something spectacular about these late night walks on clear cold nights. I would look up at the sky and there was nothing like it, the sheer amount of twinkling stars on a clear night was miraculously beautiful and filled with God's creative power. I was thinking about those skies this week as I was contemplating the coming of Epiphany.

Epiphany is the day that we celebrate the wise men following the star to find Jesus and just that act is amazing. It fills me with questions like, how did they know which star? What within them called them to follow? How did they know not to tell Herod of their journey? I am just in awe of their purpose and their sureness of their mission.

When I think about looking up at a clear night sky, there are so many beautiful stars and bright planets. It can be overwhelming to take it all in. If I was one of the wise people, how on earth would I know which star to follow? How would I know which one was the right path? With the coming of the new year, there is always this pull to make resolutions and to choose what path the new year will hold. I personally love that there is this built-in social opportunity to make new commitments and plans,

but I think it can also be overwhelming to choose what path, or which star, we will follow in the coming year. What will be our priorities? What will be our hopes and dreams? I think back to the wise people. Their hope was simply to see the Christ child. What a delightfully simple goal! But what does it mean to see the Christ child? Messiah's devotional booklet for Advent compared seeing the Christ child as coming "close to home" and I think that is a good way to describe it. In an ideal world, home should be a place where we feel wholly loved, accepted, cared for, and cherished. It should be a place of hope, joy, forgiveness, and peace.

When we think about what our priorities, goals, hopes, dreams, and which star we choose to follow in the coming year, let them be centered in bringing us closer to home, closer to the Christ child, one so new and full of promise, the little one who will become what it truly means to follow the way to our true home.

Tornado Response

"By the tender mercy of our God, the dawn from on high will break upon us, to give light to those who sit in darkness and in the shadow of death, to guide our feet into the way of peace" (Luke 1:78-79).

Friends,

On the night of Dec. 10 and early morning of Dec. 11, an outbreak of at least 30 tornadoes swept through six states. So far, 94 people are reported dead across five states, more than 80 of those in Kentucky. For those unaccounted for, search-and-rescue operations are underway. Homes and businesses were destroyed, and over 300,000 people were without electricity. Lutheran Disaster Response is collaborating with the Indiana-Kentucky Synod and other partners in the area to assess the damage and develop an immediate and a long-term response plan. Your gifts to support these response efforts will empower our partners to meet survivors' immediate and long-term needs. Given the extent of the damage, recovery will take years as thousands of homes will need to be rebuilt or repaired. With your support, Lutheran Disaster Response can accompany survivors on the long road to recovery.

Your gifts to "U.S. Tornadoes" will be used in full (100%) to help people impacted by the tornadoes until the response is complete.

The season of Advent is a time of hope as we prepare to celebrate Christ's birth. Right now, we have an opportunity to share hope with our neighbors in their time of greatest need. Please join me in prayer and consider giving if you are able by going to:

Sunday School

Messiah's Sunday School teachers and students are looking toward 2022! But first we will recap our year. Ten first through fifth grade students and 10 preschool and kindergarten students attended Sunday School overall in 2021. On average, four students attended each class, or eight students total, on any given week. We had two amazing full time Sunday School teachers as well as one part time teacher and two substitute teachers. I am so grateful for everyone who contributed to Sunday School this year! Thank you for all you have done. I also led two successful craft Sundays where the students and I considered what we were thankful for in our Thanksgiving crafts and shared our gifts to Jesus for His birthday for our Christmas crafts. Craft Sundays are a fun break from lessons where all students are invited to

come together! We are thankful for the ability to hold craft Sundays to help us celebrate holidays.

I anticipate another successful semester in 2022. We will resume on January 9, the Sunday after the school holiday break ends, to allow our teachers time off for the holidays. Then we will meet every Sunday until spring break, when we will not meet at least one of the two Sundays, either April 3 or April 10. Then, Easter is April 17, so we will not meet to allow teachers and students to spend the worship service with their families in lieu of lessons. Finally, I expect our final lesson to be held on May 22, the Sunday before Memorial Day weekend, but that is subject to change. Our policy of no food in the Sunday School rooms will continue in the new year to abide by the council's current stage of Covid-19 rules.
