From Pastor Molly

January Greetings,

When I was in college, I used to work late nights at the welcome desk and walk home through the quiet campus on dark and frigid winter nights in rural northeastern Iowa. Now, many of you know, I am not one for the cold, but there was always something spectacular about these late night walks on clear cold nights. I would look up at the sky and there was nothing like it, the sheer amount of twinkling stars on a clear night was miraculously beautiful and filled with God's creative power. I was thinking about those skies this week as I was contemplating the coming of Epiphany.

Epiphany is the day that we celebrate the wise men following the star to find Jesus and just that act is amazing. It fills me with questions like, how did they know which star? What within them called them to follow? How did they know not to tell Herod of their journey? I am just in awe of their purpose and their sureness of their mission.

When I think about looking up at a clear night sky, there are so many beautiful stars and bright planets. It can be overwhelming to take it all in. If I was one of the wise people, how on earth would I know which star to follow? How would I know which one was the right path?

With the coming of the new year, there is always this pull to make resolutions and to choose what path the new year will hold. I personally love that there is this built-in social opportunity to make new commitments and plans, but I think it can also be overwhelming to choose what path, or which star, we will follow in the coming year. What will be our priorities? What will be our hopes and dreams?

I think back to the wise people. Their hope was simply to see the Christ child. What a delightfully simple goal! But what does it mean to see the Christ child? Messiah's devotional booklet for Advent compared seeing the Christ child as coming "close to home" and I think that is a good way to describe it. In an ideal world, home should be a place where we feel wholly loved, accepted, cared for, and cherished. It should be a place of hope, joy, forgiveness, and peace.

When we think about what our priorities, goals, hopes, dreams, and which star we choose to follow in the coming year, let them be centered in bringing us closer to home, closer to the Christ child, one so new and full of promise, the little one who will become what it truly means to follow the way to our true home.

Reconciling in Christ Sunday - January 30th

As a Reconciling in Christ (RIC) congregation, Messiah Lutheran Church will observe Reconciling Sunday in our worship on Sunday January 30th. This is an opportunity to celebrate what it means to live a theology of reconciliation and lift up what being a Reconciling in Christ congregation means to us.

RIC is a program of ReconcilingWorks: Lutherans for Full Participation, begun in 1983 as a way for Lutheran communities of faith to answer the inclusive call of the Gospel by welcoming people of all sexual orientations and gender identities. Currently, there are over 930 Lutheran settings on the RIC roster, including congregations, campus ministries, synods of the ELCA and Evangelical Lutheran Church in Canada, camps, colleges, and other independent organizations. A Note from Glenda

I was asked to write about an experience we have had since arriving here in Michigan, and this is what I would like to share with you. Upon arrival in the United States, what we felt more than anything was that God loves us. We had been in a border shelter at Eagle Pass, Texas without hope and without knowing what we were going to do. We didn't have anywhere to go. After my sons and I had been there for two weeks, we met a woman who helped us and gave us the phone number of another woman who was a Mennonite pastor. She in turn helped us with bus tickets and she picked us up and brought us to the "House of Martha and Mary", which is what they call the place for people who don't have anyone to take them in. God never abandoned us and only He knew what had been prepared for us. Later, another pastor, Pastor John, put us in contact with Pastor Molly and Pastor Andrew, who agreed to accept us and support us.

I was afraid to come to Michigan but God had prepared everything, and I give thanks to God that we have been able to come here. I pray that God will bless the pastors and all of the people in this church because we have been treated like family. We are very grateful for all of you. Thank you all for caring about us and worrying about us and supporting us. I pray that God will bless all of you with a Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year.

"For in hope we were saved. Now hope that is seen is not hope. For who hopes for what is seen? But if we hope for what we do not see, we wait for it with patience." ~Romans 8: 24-25

Dear Northern Great Lakes Synod,

You have no doubt noticed the increasing darkness. The kids go to school in the dark, and soon, the school day will end as it began, in darkness. The hours of light are getting shorter and shorter, and people are grateful for lingering twilight.

How ironic that the most hopeful season of the church year begins as the darkness increases. In the weeks to come, we light candles on the Advent wreath, and it's not a moment too soon. These lights of hope stand against the growing darkness. And every week, as we add the flame of another candle, the light will increase and shine brighter even as the darkness comes sooner and lasts longer.

In this season of Hope, and as this year of Hope 2021 comes to its end, I share with you some things that I do see that give me hope:

1. Our congregations continue to find new creative ways to do ministry.

As I read through your newsletters, whether online or hard copy, I am impressed and encouraged by your continued efforts. Sure, some things have paused. Yes, some priorities have been re-evaluated and energies placed in new directions. Yet, this is all good as we continue to be church together and church for the sake of the world. I am grateful to the Spirit that is at work among and through us as the work of Christ continues.

2. We have wonderful pastoral leaders!

In the past few years, we have welcomed many new pastors and they bring new energy, perspective, and ideas. And our seasoned pastors and Licensed Lay Ministers have provided stability and the blessing of trusted relationships that keep congregational partnerships in motion and help reduce anxiety. And congregations in pastoral transition have been patient and involved, waiting for God's timing with hope.

3. <u>We have renewed joy in being together again...safely.</u>

As pandemic restrictions have eased, Pastor Jim and I are once again happy to gather with you for worship. I do not mind wearing a mask if it means we can sing together and gather in the same space. I love hearing the voices of others raised in song and prayer. It has felt like salve on a wound to share the peace, sing alto to someone's soprano, and hear combined voices pray the Lord's prayer together in the rhythm and cadence of voices in unison. While I truly believe that some sense of community can be achieved and appreciated through Zoom, YouTube, and Facebook live, the joy and value of the community gathered in person is also true and real.

4. <u>Our synod is newly connected through Lifelong Faith Formation, Pasto-ral Leader Check-Ins, and various Zoom meetings.</u>

While I have missed being able to add lunch and snacks to in person Synod meetings, in many ways we are more connected as a synod than we have ever been. Teachers and students from the Copper Country to Marinette, from Ironwood to Sault Ste. Marie gather in virtual classrooms and discussion groups. We are church together in a whole new way, gathering to discuss and wrestle with conversations about issues of race, scriptural interpretation, and to consider and plan various ministry efforts.

5. God is at work!

In all our efforts, in all our re-evaluations, in all the changes and future uncertainty, the Spirit of the living Christ is gathering, inspiring, supporting, and guiding. We are discovering again what it means to be church, what the purpose of the Body of Christ is in this world, and who we are in mission together. I see a new hunger for deeper spirituality and for meaningful connectedness to God and each other. I see ministry efforts taking on a life of their own. I see details and pieces falling together. I see a willingness to experiment, to try new things, to jump even when the landing is unclear.

There is much to be hopeful for because of what we can see even as we continue to hope for that which is still becoming. As Advent candles are lit, as the glow from the manger bed grows brighter, as we strain to hear the songs of angels, remember that you are not alone. In hopeful anticipation of Christmas and a blessed New Year, I believe it is not too soon to share the following verse from "It Came upon the Midnight Clear" that speaks anew to our present circumstances:

And you, beneath life's crushing load, whose forms are bending low, who toil along the climbing way with painful steps and slow: look now, for glad and golden hours come swiftly on the wing; Oh, rest beside the weary road and hear the angels sing!
