Siblings in Christ,

Have you seen the geese fly overhead? Or wandering around in Park Cemetery? They're a telltale sign of Spring here in the UP and they've made their return. Maybe you find them to be obnoxious, and so they can be, but in the Celtic tradition geese are a sign of the Holy Spirit.

Whether you believe that or not, the Spirit is among us! It is calling upon our imagination, challenging us, and embracing us. It is with us in the Good Friday and Holy Saturday darkness and in the light of Easter morning. The Spirit is present during pandemic and war, and physical and emotional winters. It is fierce, stubborn, and loud. Yet it is also graceful, protective, and gentle. The Spirit holds us as we navigate the disconcerting and hopeful truth of an empty tomb. The Spirit brings us together with Christ in the ordinary moments of our days. The Spirit moves, pushes, dances, and cajoles. The Holy Spirit calls to each of us and to the church, meeting us wherever we are.

As we live into this Easter season, I encourage you to look for the Spirit in your midst. Whether it is a hard day or an easy one, the Holy Spirit is there. Maybe it looks like geese, but maybe it looks like a conversation, a sunset, or the beauty of a song. Maybe an idea, a story, a passage of Scripture, or a dream. Maybe it looks messy or maybe it looks tidy. Look and listen for where the Spirit is moving in your life.

Maybe you're familiar with the poem "Wild Geese," by Mary Oliver. It's one of her more famous ones and one that came to mind as I thought about the geese, and the Holy Spirit,

You do not have to be good.

You do not have to walk on your knees

for a hundred miles through the desert, repenting.

You only have to let the soft animal of your body

love what it loves.

Tell me about despair, yours, and I will tell you mine.

Meanwhile the world goes on.

Meanwhile the sun and the clear pebbles of the rain

are moving across the landscapes,

over the prairies and the deep trees,

the mountains and the rivers.

Meanwhile the wild geese, high in the clean blue air,

are heading home again.

Whoever you are, no matter how lonely,

the world offers itself to your imagination,

calls to you like the wild geese, harsh and exciting-

over and over announcing your place

in the family of things.

As we enter this Easter season, remember that the Spirit has a place for you, that God has a place for you, and that God's grace is abundant. Dwell in God's love and listen for it, even if it sounds like the squawk of a goose.

Suppers For Six

Suppers for Six is a fun, yet relaxing, and easy way to get to know other folks who attend our Messiah. It is an opportunity to meet new people, form new friendships, and get to know each other better.

Three couples (or a combination of couples and singles) are grouped together for a three-month period. Over the course of three months, these six people will gather at least once a month to share a meal together. The groups can choose to meet in a home, in a restaurant, or for a picnic.

If interested, a sign-up sheet is available on the Welcome Table outside the church office (or contact the church office). At the end of May, once folks have signed up, groups will be formed and everyone in the group will be notified and given a list of the group members and contact information (and who will be hosting first, second, and third). The meals are meant to be potluck with everyone bringing something to share or for groups that prefer not to cook, you can meet at an agreed upon restaurant. The group can be as creative or simple as they choose in the meals they enjoy.

What about kids? Parents are welcome to sign up (please do!), and it is up to the individual group to determine if children will be a part of the meal or not. Ideas for dealing with the kids include: children can play or watch TV quietly in another room after the meal so the adults can talk, a teen child of someone in the group might be willing to baby sit young children at the parent's home, or parents of young children may need to find their own baby sitter.

Job – When Justice Goes Wrong

Why do bad things happen? Faith has wrestled with this question for thousands of years. The book of Job begins with the story of a good man who suffered and did not deserve it. Everything he loved was wrenched away from him; and Job cried out to God: “I just don’t understand!”

Then came his “friends,” who all had easy answers. “You must have deserved it,” or “This will make you a better person.” And Job still cried out to God. And then God answered...

What was God’s answer? And how would it affect our lives? Come explore this book with us, for six sessions on Wednesday evenings starting May 4th (meeting at 7:00 pm in room 202). Be warned: this book pulls no punches. Both Job and Job’s friends who criticize him make their best case, in some of the finest poetry in the Hebrew Bible, all of them drawing on arguments deeply rooted in the Scripture. Job was written for people who were ready to ask hard questions. So much so, that people committed to easy answers have sometimes thought it just shouldn’t be in the Bible! But it is.
