Centering Prayer Group

Beginning in April, there will be two opportunities to meet together each week: during the day on <u>Tuesdays, from 11:00 am - 12:00 pm</u> or in the early evening on <u>Thursdays from 5:30-6:30 pm</u>. A short intro to the method will precede each meeting. So feel free to come at anytime. Each meeting stands on its own. Meetings will take place at Messiah Evangelical Lutheran Church. All are welcome.

What is centering prayer? Centering prayer is a Christian form of meditation. Instead of talking to God, who already knows all things and all of our needs, it is a form of listening. The practice has simple steps:

The choosing of a sacred word, as the symbol of your intention to consent to God's presence and action within.

Sitting comfortably and with eyes closed, settle briefly and silently introduce the sacred word as the symbol of your consent to God's presence and action within.

When engaged with your thoughts, (and "thoughts" include body sensations, feelings, images, and reflections) return ever-so-gently to the sacred word.

At the end of the prayer period remain in silence with eyes closed for a couple of minutes. After our period of centering prayer, when hearts are more open to inspiration, we will have a reading to ponder. (Lectio Divina)

Personal Care Kits

Ruth Circle will be collecting items for Personal Care Kits in March & April for Lutheran World Relief. People who must flee their homes quickly often do not have time to pack essential items. These kits can help refugees maintain personal hygiene while living in exile. The kits are a reminder to those receiving them that someone cares for them.

Items needed for each kit include:

- 1 bath towel, dark color preferred
- 1 toothbrush, adult size in original wrapper
- 1 comb, large toothed preferred
- 1 metal nail clipper
- 2 bath size bars of soap

ELCA World Hunger – What's YOUR 50??

The ELCA was established in 1987 with the merger of three church bodies, The American Luther Church (ALC), The American Evangelical Lutheran Church (AELC) and the Lutheran Church in America (LCA). Each of those church bodies had hunger fund drives which go back to 1974 when a major famine struck Africa and the US was hit with drought and crop failures. This year, 2024 marks 50 years since those precipitating events.

Many of us remember 1999 when the fund was 25 years old, Sunday School kids in the ELCA were encouraged to put aside 25 cents per day and the quarters were saved in plastic film cannisters (remember them?) Members were urged to give in multiples of 25, youth groups were challenged to raise funds equivalent to the cost of 25 gym shoes, etc.

This year we deal with 50 something. Is it 50 cents per day for 50 days? That's 25 dollars. How about a dollar a day for 50 days? Good Friday is 50 days before the Synod Assembly – a good time frame to focus on keeping the ELCA fund alive and well and PLANTING SEEDS* for another 50 years. This is the theme of this year's Synod Assembly on Saturday, May 18.

If you are interested in providing assistance, they could use warm meals/snacks, Gatorade, paper products, hygiene products, returnable can/bottles (can be dropped off at SCRCO's office, 620 S. Lake St.) and monetary assistance. There is a box for donations in the narthex.
