I have been showered with love by you all as we approach the birth of our baby girl. I have been thinking a lot about how gratitude changes your heart and mind. Pregnancy hasn't been particularly easy and during this spring, the weather combined with the state of the world compounded by pregnancy physical struggles and hormonal shifts have left me often feeling tired and down. It's been hard to be upbeat and happy even though I am excited about welcoming our baby into our family and church family. On a particularly low day, my dear husband said that when he goes to work in the mornings, he ritually thanks God for me and our cats and the life we have together. I think this is a simple and beautiful practice. Since then, I have been trying to focus more on how to be intentional about gratitude. We can often overlook the simple things that should bring us great joy: family and friends, sunshine or even a kind gesture from a stranger. Often these get buried under our woes and frustrations. And so, being purposeful about saying thank you to God and one another can be a wonderful and centering reminder about all the good that exists in our lives.

The Bible is of course full of woes (it is about human beings after all!) but it also has some great passages about being thankful, like this one from Psalms:

Psalm 107 says, O give thanks to the Lord, for he is good,

for his steadfast love endures forever.

- 2 Let the redeemed of the Lord say so,
- those he redeemed from trouble
- 3 and gathered in from the lands,
- from the east and from the west,
- from the north and from the south.
- 8 Let them thank the Lord for his steadfast love, for his wonderful works to humankind.
- 9 For he satisfies the thirsty, and the hungry he fills with good things.

I think so many of us are hungry for good things right now as we witness to a world in distress and upheaval. Part of that is remembering and creating those good things and then keeping them at the forefront of our minds so that they are what we go to when things feel hard, overwhelming, or depressing. God has the power to turn anything good, but we must be working with God and opening our eyes to see the goodness.

I leave you with this prayer of gratitude that could accompany your list of thankfulness each day.

God of all that is good, thank you for showing us your goodness again and again. Thank you for your blessings and hope, even when we face the hardest times. Thank you for showing us love and how to love one another through Jesus Christ. When we fail at being grateful, we are thankful that your mercy and grace carry us. Be with us now and always and help us to turn to you with soft hearts and renewed spirits. In Jesus name we pray, amen.

Council Update – March 2025

At its March meeting, Messiah's Church Council continued to guide our congregation's mission with prayerful conversation and thoughtful decisions. Financially, we remain in a healthy position, despite a slight dip in February giving. Thanks to faithful stewardship and careful budgeting, we remain on track for the year. You can read more in this newsletter (pg. 16) about a matching fund opportunity Council approved to help complete our audio/ visual upgrades—an exciting step forward for worship and community use of our space.

Council approved a lease for 1024 N. Fourth St. with the Outdoor Adventure Therapy School (OATS) Therapy Collective, reflecting our commitment to supporting community wellness through partnerships that align with our values. The house will serve as a space for individual, couples, and group therapy with therapists and as a base for outdoor operations and staff. We also discussed the proposed Magnetic Street development, lifting concerns about increased parking pressures in our neighborhood and the ongoing need for truly affordable housing in Marquette (Pr. Andrew sent a letter on Messiah's behalf).

We were delighted to welcome several new members into the Messiah family: Josh McIvor-Anderson and his children, Dietrich and Jamie Spickerman, and Marina Shinkarenko. Be sure to greet them warmly and help them feel at home!

Finally, Council approved updates to our building use policy. While explicitly partisan groups remain excluded, we continue to welcome issue-focused organizations whose work aligns with our Welcome Statement and mission. New clarifications also address the use of substances such as marijuana on church property.

Our April meeting was canceled, and Council will next meet on Wednesday, May 21st at 6:30 pm. As always, the meeting is open to all of you. Thank you for your continued prayers and support as we strive to live out our shared call to love boldly, welcome fully, and serve faithfully.

Centering Prayer

What is the purpose of centering prayer? Simply to consent to God's Presence and action within. You can practice it yourself at home, or you can join others in the practice. Not all knowledge comes from books, or words, or others. We were promised an Advocate but in order to hear the guidance of that Advocate, we must go into a private place and listen. The practice is this:

With the intention to consent to God's Presence and action within-

Choose a sacred word, as a symbol of consent to God's presence and action within. It should be a simple word or phrase which keeps reminding us of our intention to seek God's guidance.

Sit or lie comfortably, and close your eyes. Gently introduce your sacred word.

Whenever you find yourself distracted by thoughts, emotions, bodily sensations (and you WILL find this happening)--ever so gently return to your sacred word. Repeat this step about 10 million times.

At the end of your prayer time, sit briefly to allow yourself to come back to the physical moment.

Traditionally, most centering prayer teachers recommend two silent sittings of 20 minutes, twice daily. This is often too much for beginners. Better to begin with a short amount of time–3 to 5 minutes–when you are establishing your practice. The most important thing is to keep at it and if you make it too onerous, you won't keep at it. YouTube has videos about centering prayer; opportunities to practice with others online can be found at www.meditationchapel.org Books that are helpful by Thomas Keating are: "Open Mind, Open Heart" and "Invitation to Love."

You are invited to join us on Tuesdays from 11-12. No need to commit to every meeting. Come when you can. We sit together in silent practice for 20 minutes and follow our prayer time with Lectio Divina (readings that have inspired or supported God's command to love God and love one another).

Your Prayer Requests at Messiah

At every Saturday & Sunday worship service, we ask people to fill out a welcome card that is found in the bulletin. The card asks people to put their prayer requests on the back, and these requests are prayed for every Tuesday morning at Messiah's staff meeting. If you wish to have your name or a loved one's name read during worship, please call the office or let the pastors or Jen know. We will need to get permission before we include anyone's name in the worship prayers.

Bringing Sound and Vision to Life: Help Us Complete Our A/V Upgrades

Three years ago, a generous and anonymous donor helped launch a muchneeded transformation of our audio and visual systems at Messiah. That initial gift sparked exciting progress: a clearer and more reliable speaker system in the sanctuary, upgraded sanctuary audio wiring, improved projection and streaming capabilities, and much needed initial updates to our internet infrastructure. These changes have already made a big difference in how we gather, worship, and connect—both in person and online.

But there's more work to do.

As our worship life evolves and our building continues to serve as a home for community and connection, it's time to finish what was started. We're now raising funds for the next phase of A/V improvements that will help us better serve everyone who comes through our doors.

Here's what's next:

• Improving the T-Coil hearing system for those with hearing aids, to make worship more accessible for all.

• Refreshing the speakers in the narthex, atrium, and nursery—and connecting them to the sanctuary system so that spaces like the nursery and Saturday evening worship can fully participate in sound.

• Creating a centralized A/V and internet closet near the sanctuary and office for better management and reliability.

• Rewiring outdated internet infrastructure throughout much of our building to support streaming, communication, and day-to-day operations.

• Upgrading the Magnuson Hall sound system so it can be a reliable space for worship, meetings, and events.

• Adding a large screen TV to the Atrium for overflow worship and presentations—welcoming all into the experience, even when the sanctuary is full.

It's a bold vision, but it's rooted in the same spirit that launched these improvements years ago: a commitment to inclusion, accessibility, and excel-

lence in how we gather as the body of Christ.

To help reach our goal of nearly \$30,000, Messiah's Church Council has approved a matching initiative using undesignated memorial funds—so every dollar you give will be matched, doubling the impact of your generosity.

Thank you for all the ways you support Messiah—with your time, your gifts, and your love. Together, we can make sure our worship and community spaces serve us well—not just today, but for years to come.
