Bringing Sound and Vision to Life: Help Us Complete Our A/V Upgrades

Three years ago, a generous and anonymous donor helped launch a much-needed transformation of our audio and visual systems at Messiah. That initial gift sparked exciting progress: a clearer and more reliable speaker system in the sanctuary, upgraded sanctuary audio wiring, improved projection and streaming capabilities, and much needed initial updates

to our internet infrastructure. These changes have already made a big difference in how we gather, worship, and connect—both in person and online.

But there's more work to do.

As our worship life evolves and our building continues to serve as a home for community and connection, it's time to finish what was started. We're now raising funds for the next phase of A/V improvements that will help us better serve everyone who comes through our doors.

Here's what's next:

- Improving the T-Coil hearing system for those with hearing aids, to make worship more accessible for all.
- Refreshing the speakers in the narthex, atrium, and nursery—and connecting them to the sanctuary system so that spaces like the nursery and Saturday evening worship can fully participate in sound.
- Creating a centralized A/V and internet closet near the sanctuary and office for better management and reliability.
- Rewiring outdated internet infrastructure throughout much of our building to support streaming, communication, and day-to-day operations.
- Upgrading the Magnuson Hall sound system so it can be a reliable space for worship, meetings, and events.
- Adding a large screen TV to the Atrium for overflow worship and presentations—welcoming all into the experience, even when the sanctuary is full.

It's a bold vision, but it's rooted in the same spirit that launched these improvements years ago: a commitment to inclusion, accessibility, and excellence in how we gather as the body of Christ.

To help reach our goal of nearly \$30,000, Messiah's Church Council has approved a matching initiative using undesignated memorial funds—so every dollar you give will be matched, doubling the impact of your generosity.

You can give by check or online, noting "A/V projects" in the memo line.

Thank you for all the ways you support Messiah—with your time, your gifts, and your love. Together, we can make sure our worship and community spaces serve us well—not just today, but for years to come.

Let's finish what we started—together.

Are You a Pianist?

Do you play the piano? Are you free occasionally during the day? Would you like to volunteer as a pianist once or twice a month at an intermittent service that we might hold? If this interests you, please contact the church office.

Centering Prayer

What is the purpose of centering prayer? Simply to consent to God's Presence and action within. You can practice it yourself at home, or you can join others in the practice. Not all

knowledge comes from books, or words, or others. We were promised an Advocate but in order to hear the guidance of that Advocate, we must go into a private place and listen. The practice is this:

With the intention to consent to God's Presence and action within-

Choose a sacred word, as a symbol of consent to God's presence and action within. It should be a simple word or phrase which keeps reminding us of our intention to seek God's guidance. Sit or lie comfortably, and close your eyes. Gently introduce your sacred word.

Whenever you find yourself distracted by thoughts, emotions, bodily sensations (and you WILL find this happening)--ever so gently return to your sacred word. Repeat this step about 10 million times.

At the end of your prayer time, sit briefly to allow yourself to come back to the physical moment.

Traditionally, most centering prayer teachers recommend two silent sittings of 20 minutes, twice daily. This is often too much for beginners. Better to begin with a short amount of time—3 to 5 minutes—when you are establishing your practice. The most important thing is to keep at it and if you make it too onerous, you won't keep at it. YouTube has videos about centering prayer; opportunities to practice with others online can be found at www.meditationchapel.org Books that are helpful by Thomas Keating are: "Open Mind, Open Heart" and "Invitation to Love."

You are invited to join us on Tuesdays from 11-12. No need to commit to every meeting. Come when you can. We sit together in silent practice for 20 minutes and follow our prayer time with Lectio Divina (readings that have inspired or supported God's command to love God and love one another).

Nick's Run for Recovery - May 17

It's time for Superior Connections Recovery Community Organization's (SCRCO) 3rd Annual "Nick's Run for Recovery", to be held in downtown Marquette. This run is held to bring awareness to the growing issue of substance use and mental health in our area and is held in honor of the late Nicholas Suardini, who lost his life to these crises.

Funds from this fun run/walk will be used to support Superior Connections mission of cultivating a culture of long-term recovery by creating connections and reducing barriers for those affected by substance use by supporting our Recovery Residence program. We currently have two homes (Marquette & Ishpeming) that house four men each and add programming to function at NARR (National Alliance of Recovery Residence, Inc.) Level 3 standards.

This year's run will be held on Saturday, May 17, 2025 and will follow the same 5k route as last year. Pre-race check-in will be held at Elizabeth's Chop House on Front St at 9:00am; participants will receive local resource information, a race number, & Nick's run merch (including a T-shirt). Participants will then make their way to the clock tower for a word from Nick's sister, Sarah Suardini, before our event begins. The event will follow the bike path along Lake Superior to just past Picnic Rocks Park before returning to the clock tower to finish.

Tickets will be available on race day for \$35.
