Coming in August: “Revealed – Hope at the Edge of the World”

A New Sermon Series on the Book of Revelation

Starting in August, we're going to spend five Sundays with a book that many of us have avoided, misunderstood, or just found a little...weird: Revelation.

But what if it's not about predicting the end of the world? What if it's about how to live in the world—faithfully, courageously, hopefully—even when things feel like they're falling apart?

This series is an invitation to read Revelation not with fear, but with open eyes and open hands. We'll talk about empire and allegiance, beauty and resistance, and the kind of hope that doesn't ignore what's hard but moves through it.

There is a daily devotional to guide us through the month. It is available on the small table outside the church office. Please help yourself. Plenty of space for honest questions. And (I hope) a fresh look at a strange and stunning text.

If you're looking for a thoughtful way to engage the tension between faith and empire, hope and realism, Revelation might have more to say than you've been led to believe. – Pr. Andrew

This Here Flesh — September Book Study

What does it mean to live with dignity? To carry memory, fear, hope, and joy in a body that longs for healing? This September, we're inviting you to read *This Here Flesh* by Cole Arthur Riley—a beautiful, thought-provoking book that weaves together story, spirituality, and justice. Riley writes with honesty and beauty—poetic, grounded, and deeply rooted in lived experience. She explores themes like lament, rest, liberation, and wonder—not as abstract ideas, but as threads woven into our everyday lives.

We'll meet once in September to talk about what moved us, what challenged us, and what's still stirring beneath the surface. No homework. No pressure. Just a chance to show up, reflect, and be part of something honest and real. Books are available in the church office for \$15. All are welcome—bring your story, your questions, and maybe a friend.

4. Provide housing for two or more of them for one or two of the weeks they are here. a. Hosting would include some meals (especially breakfast) and transportation (usually to Messiah to meet the bus) b. Hosting for about half of the visit is a fine option.
5. Invite some of them to your home for a meal.

What is Centering Prayer?

Centering prayer is a form of silent prayer that emphasizes resting in God's presence through silence and a sacred word. It involves finding a quiet space, sitting comfortably, and focusing on a chosen word to help maintain stillness and let go of thoughts. The goal is to cultivate a deeper relationship with God through stillness and receptivity. Several members of Messiah lead groups that practice this form of prayer throughout the week as a piece of their faith life. - *Pr. Molly Hunter*

Centering Prayer - "Be In the World But Not of the World"

Stillness before God transforms us into unhurried love. It is in the stillness of silent prayer that God turns over the soil of our hearts, revealing our desires to us and the source of their fullest satisfaction. When we stop moving, stop talking, and arrive present and quiet before God, he takes all of our disordered desires, distorted attachments, and codependences and transforms them into love.

When we use others to meet our needs, we can't love them. Codependent people don't truly love each other. They're using each other. Each needs the other to feel okay. When we need the world, need something from the world, need something from the fearfully and wonderfully made people who populate the world to make us feel whole ourselves, we can't love.

God has to break our attachments to the world so we can truly love the world. God has to break our attachments to the people in it who feed our egos so we can truly see others, know

others, welcome others, and love others. The place where this happens is silent prayer. From *“Praying Like Monks, Living Like Fools”* by Tyler Staton

Opportunities to practice centering prayer with others: Tuesdays from 11-noon. No need to attend every session, come when you are able. We meditate together for 20 minutes; this is followed by inspirational readings for us to ponder. The Holy Spirit is the one in charge of these sessions. Our goal is to consent to God’s Presence and Action within.

There are two other Centering Prayer sessions at Messiah; one on Mondays, starting at 5:30 pm, it is an 11-step Centering Prayer and there is a second one on Thursdays at 1:30 pm - -

A Daily Guide for August

August 1 – Savor the Season

Notice what you love about summer—ripe fruit, warm sun, long days. Say thank you to God for what fills your senses with joy.

August 2 – Morning Light

Wake early enough to sit with the sunrise or morning quiet. Let the light remind you that each day begins in grace.

August 3 – Write a Thank You

Send a thank-you note or message to someone who’s made your summer better, even in a small way.

August 4 – Eat with Gratitude

Slow down as you eat today. Taste each bite. Give thanks for the farmers, workers, and hands that brought it to your table.

August 5 – Let Go a Little

What are you holding too tightly? Let something go today—an expectation, a task, a worry. Trust that not everything depends on you.

August 6 – Sabbath in Summer

Set aside time today to rest. Sit outside. Take a nap. Listen to crickets or the wind. Let creation teach you how to pause.

August 7 – School Supplies Prayer

Whether you're a student, teacher, parent, or simply near a school community, say a prayer over the tools of learning and those who use them.

August 8 – Notice the Transition

Feel the air change? Are the evenings getting shorter? Welcome the turning of time with curiosity, not resistance.

August 9 – Bless the Children

Pray for the children in your life—those you know and those you don't. Ask God to surround them with care and delight.

August 10 – Practice Presence

Be where you are today. Resist multitasking for an hour. Pay attention to the world around you.

August 11 – Look Up

Spend a few moments looking at the sky. Cloudy or clear, bright or dark—lift your eyes and rest in wonder.

August 12 – A Mid-Year Check-In

We're over halfway through the year. What has surprised you? What are you grateful for?

August 13 – Back-to-School Memories

Remember your own back-to-school experiences. What feelings come up? Offer them to God—whether joy, fear, awkwardness, or hope.

August 14 – Prayer for Educators

Pray for teachers, aides, staff, and administrators. Ask God to give them wisdom, patience, and a sense of deep purpose.

August 15 – A Late Summer Walk

Take a walk and notice what's blooming, what's fading, and what's going to seed. Let the natural world remind you that change is sacred.

August 16 – Make a Gratitude List

Write down five things you're thankful for today—without overthinking. Small or big, they're all grace.

August 17 – Practice Gentleness

Approach your day with softness. Move slowly. Speak kindly. Treat yourself and others with tender care.

August 18 – Reflect on Growth

How have you grown this summer? What new rhythms or insights might you carry into the next season?

August 19 – Bless a Backpack

Bless your own bag, your child's backpack, or someone else's with this prayer: *"God, may this bag carry tools for learning, reminders of your presence, and signs of your peace."*

August 20 – A Prayer for Change

Say: *"God, help me greet change with trust. Let me carry forward what matters and release what no longer fits."*

August 21 – Savor a Summer Sound

What sounds say "summer" to you—waves, birds, fans, laughter, lawn mowers? Listen deeply. Give thanks.

August 22 – Say Goodbye Well

Name something you're saying goodbye to—vacation, a slower pace, a place. Honor it. Thank God for it. Let it go.

August 23 – Bless the Threshold

If you or someone you know is on the edge of something new, say: *"God, bless this threshold. Give courage, joy, and rootedness in love."*

August 24 – Clean with Intention

Tidy or clean a small space. As you do, offer a quiet prayer: *"Prepare me for what's ahead."*

August 25 – Gratitude for Play

What has brought you joy or fun this summer? Celebrate it. Play again if you can.

August 26 – Pray for Students

Pray for those beginning or continuing school—at any age. Ask for wisdom, belonging, resilience, and curiosity.

August 27 – Light a Candle

As the days shorten, light a candle and say: *"God, be the light that steadies me in all seasons."*

August 28 – Notice the Details

Take 10 minutes to observe a single thing—an insect, a leaf, your hands, a photo. Let awe rise.

August 29 – Share a Meal

Eat with someone today. Whether at home or out, savor the connection. Thank God for nourishment and companionship.

August 30 – Give Thanks for the Season

Say a simple prayer: *“God, thank you for this summer—for what it offered, what it taught, and what it became.”*

August 31 – Blessing for What’s Ahead

Pray: *“God of all seasons, walk with me into what’s next. Let me bring gratitude, wonder, and peace with me. Amen.”*
