

Greetings,

As we move into October, I have been thinking back to my sabbatical last fall where I studied Celtic Christianity and traveled to Scotland. It was on this same trip, while in Edinburgh where I also found out I was pregnant. It was a bit of a surprise as I took the test in the bathroom of a coffee shop called the Black Sheep after a day of suspicious symptoms. After that surprise, I spent a lot of the trip thinking about the baby that would become my smiley and squishy 3 month old baby, Marigold.

All this thought about babies made me feel even more connected to Saint Brigid. In Celtic Christianity, Saint Brigid's birth historically marks the time period between Paganism and Christianity. She is said to have been born in a doorway and the daughter of a pagan father and Christian mother. While the historical figure found the monastery at Kildare, there is a lot of fictional lore about her. One of my favorite images is her being carried by angels from Ireland to the holy land where she is said to have been present at the birth of Jesus. The story goes that she served as the midwife to Jesus and Mary.

I love this story because it reminds me of the human need for support and care. While the 5th century Brigid was obviously not at the birth of Jesus, there is this human desire to put her there to care for the infant and mother. It's this beautiful yearning to provide protection in vulnerable times.

I have learned a lot about the need for help, support and an extra pair of arms while taking care of my baby for these past three months. It takes a village, but really, all of life takes a village. We are best loved and supported when we allow others to be there for us. Jesus is an example of that to us, living in community, caring for those in vulnerable situations but also needing the caring touch of Mary anointing him with oil. None of us are immune from finding ourselves in need of care at some point in our life. Being a

new mom reminded me that I also need to be willing to accept care too. So, whether you're a new parent like me, caring for your growing children, facing an illness, tending to an aging parent, or just needing some extra support, remember that it is a part of our faith to give and to receive and there is no shame in that, only grace.

As summer turns to fall, we give thanks for the steady generosity of Messiah's community. (At the end of August, giving remains strong & expenses are running lower than expected [partially due to seasonal costs], putting us in a healthier position than last year.)

Already this year, nearly \$40,000 has been shared with neighbors in need—supporting hundreds of individuals and families with rent, utilities, and gas during difficult times. (At this time last year, that number was \$28,000). This is a powerful witness of God's love at work through you.

We are deeply grateful for all the ways you give—through offerings, through service, and through prayer. As we step into the months ahead, may we continue to embody generosity together, trusting that God provides more than enough for the work we are called to do. — *Messiah's Finance Committee*

What is Centering Prayer?

Centering prayer is a form of silent prayer that emphasizes resting in God's presence through silence and a sacred word. It involves finding a quiet space, sitting comfortably, and focusing on a chosen word to help maintain stillness and let go of thoughts. The goal is to cultivate a deeper relationship with God through stillness and receptivity. Several members of Messiah lead groups that practice this form of prayer throughout the week as a piece of their faith life. -- Pr. Molly Hunter

Centering Prayer

But when you pray, go to your room, shut the door, and pray to God who is in that secret place, and your Abba God-who sees all that is done in secret, will reward you... Your God knows what you need before you ask it. Matthew 6:6, 7 The Inclusive Bible

The Spirit of God has made a home in you. Romans 8:9

Be silent and know that I am God! Psalm 46:10

"There are all kinds of ways in which God speaks to us-through our thoughts or any one of our faculties. But keep in mind that God's first language is silence. Prepare yourself for silence in this prayer, and if other things happen, that is His problem, not yours. As soon as you make it your problem, you tend to desire something that is other than God. Pure faith will bring you closer to God than anything else. To be attached to an experience of God is not God, it is a thought. The time of centering prayer is the time to let go of all thoughts, even the best of thoughts. If they are really good, they will come back later.

Don't judge centering prayer on the basis of how many thoughts come or how much peace you enjoy. The only way to judge this prayer is by its long-range fruits: whether in daily life you enjoy greater peace, humility and charity. Having come to deep interior silence, you begin to relate to others beyond the superficial aspects of social status, race, nationality, religion and personal characteristics." Thomas Keating

We meet every Tuesday for 20 minutes of centering prayer practice followed by Lectio Divina. All are welcome and you do not need to have been practicing centering prayer as the instructions are simple and we go over them for newcomers. You also do not need to commit to attendance every week. Come when you can. Tuesdays from 11-noon.
